D. BACKGROUND AND EXPERIENCE	
Please briefly present the partner organization.	<p>Nouvelle Communauté Internationale (NCI) is a non-profit, non-governmental youth organization, legally established in France on July 9, 2024, under the Law of 1901. NCI was founded by a dynamic group of former international volunteers who are passionate about transforming their personal experiences into structured support for a new generation of young people. Our core mission is to valorize, inform, and raise awareness about international volunteering and mobility opportunities. We are dedicated to defending the status of volunteers, empowering youth to recognize and articulate the valuable skills gained abroad, and actively promoting mobility programs within all spaces frequented by youth. Our activities are rooted in the principles of international solidarity,</p>

	<p>intercultural understanding, and active citizenship, with a strategic focus on contributing to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). We operate with the conviction that international mobility is a powerful tool for personal, professional, and societal development.</p>

Communication & Digital Outreach: We have built a robust digital presence to reach and engage young people. This includes a professional website (nci.onl) offering resources and personalized guidance, alongside active social media channels (Facebook, Instagram, LinkedIn). Through these platforms, we share volunteering opportunities, practical advice, and a weekly series of testimonials from former volunteers to inspire and inform their peers.</p> <p>2. Capacity Building & Training (Non-Formal Education): We design and deliver educational activities to equip young people with the necessary tools for mobility. ▪ Workshops: We have organized workshops, both online and in-person, on topics such as "Introduction to Erasmus+ and the European Solidarity Corps" and "Valuing Competences Gained Through Volunteering." ▪ We have developed a specialized training curriculum for aspiring volunteers, covering animation techniques, intercultural communication, and project management, that launched in April 2025.</p> <p>3. Direct Youth Support & Mentorship: We provide hands-on support to young people. ▪ Guidance: We have successfully accompanied a dozen young French individuals in their European mobility journey, assisting them with finding host organizations and preparing high-quality applications. ▪ Mentorship Program: We are currently structuring a mentorship program to connect experienced former volunteers with youth who are considering a mobility experience, creating a peer-to-peer support network.</p> <p>4. International Cooperation & Awareness Events: We actively build international partnerships and organize events to promote our mission. ▪ France-Benin Collaboration: We organized a binational awareness day on volunteering in both France and Benin. This culminated in a major event on January 18, 2025, at the University of Abomey-Calavi (Benin) titled "Appeal for International Solidarity: Volunteering, an opportunity for discovery and learning," which gathered students and young professionals. ▪ Partnership Development: We have established a strategic partnership with the CRD BENIN cooperative to collaborate on environmental and cultural projects, and we are actively building a network of partner NGOs across Europe to expand opportunities for youth. ▪ Future Projects: We are planning a KA1 Youth Exchange project and developing a reciprocal exchange program with Benin in partnership with FONJEP.</p>
